WHAT IS CHILD SEX TRAFFICKING AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

Human trafficking involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act. Any child under the age of 18 engaged in commercial sex is a victim of human trafficking according to federal law. Trafficking does not require movement, border crossing or transportation.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?

RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS OF A VICTIM

- Does the victim seem disoriented or lost?
- Does the victim seem to be under someone's control?
- Are they avoiding social interaction and/or eye contact?
- Do they have bruises in various stages of healing?
- Do you notice any other signs of abuse?
- Do they not have control of travel identification or documents?
- Does the relationship appear to be phony or uncomfortable?

HOW TO RESPOND

- Do not get directly involved.
- Do not confront the suspected trafficker or victim to ensure their safety and alert them to your suspicions.
- Do report your observations to a flight crew, front desk of resort or airport security.
- Include as many details as possible about the suspected trafficker and victim:
 - Whether they are currently in-flight
 - Airline, flight number, seat number, flight info
 - Physical descriptions
 - Indications of trafficking you witnessed or heard
